'Mix' jackpot grows; 'Cash 5' prize shared

HARRISBURG (AP) — Monday's "mix & match" jackpot will be worth at least \$75,000 because no player holds a ticket with one row that matches all five numbers drawn in Thursday's game, lottery officials said. Meanwhile, five tickets matched all five numbers drawn in Thursday's "Cash 5" game and each holder will receive \$158,413. Also, 227 players matched four numbers and won \$260,500 each; 7,665 players matched three numbers to win \$12,500, and 98,237 players matched two numbers for \$1.
